HEART CATHETERIZATION WITH OR WITHOUT ANGIOPLASTY

WHAT TIME SHOULD I ARRIVE?
The Heart Lab Staff will call you between 2pm - 4pm the day prior to your test with your arrival time. The approximate time of your procedure is not known until the day before your test. If you will not be available at that time to receive the call, or if you don't get a call by 4pm, please call to confirm your arrival time.

INSTRUCTIONS:
 ☑ Please review the information provided in your procedure information packet prior to coming to the hospital. ☑ If you were given an order for labwork, please have it drawn several days before your procedure. Take your order with you. You do not need an appointment for your preadmission testing. ☑ You must have someone to drive you home and stay with you overnight after your procedure, unless you are admitted to the hospital. ☑ Do not eat or drink anything except for sips of water with your medication(s) after 12 midnight the night before your procedure. ☑ Please bring all your medications to the hospital the day of your procedure. They will be sent home with you. You will not be permitted to take medications brought in from home while you are in the hospital. ☑ If you are allergic to shellfish, iodine or x-ray dye, please tell the staff. ☐ Other instructions
Medication Instructions: your doctor office will give you instructions below

SUMMARY OF THE TEST: A heart cath is an x-ray to view the arteries, chambers and valves of the heart. A soft narrow plastic catheter (tube) is inserted through the arm or groin and guided through a blood vessel to the heart. A special x-ray dye, called contrast is injected through the catheter, which allows the cardiologist (heart doctor) see the heart structures.

If there is a significant blockage in one or more of the heart arteries, your cardiologist may perform an **ANGIOPLASTY**. An angioplasty uses a small balloon which is inflated to open up the blocked area and place a **STENT** (wire mesh tube) to keep the artery open.

WHAT TO EXPECT: You may be given medicine to help you relax. You will feel the "bee sting" of medicine injected in the skin to numb the arm or leg. This may be the most uncomfortable part of the procedure. When the area is numb, the doctor will start your procedure.

During the procedure, you may feel a warm flush during some of the times the contrast is injected into your heart. You will be awake and may be asked questions during the procedure. If the procedure is done through your leg, strong pressure may be applied for 30 minutes or more to make sure the bleeding has stopped. This may be uncomfortable. Let the nurse know if it is painful.

WHAT TO BRING TO THE HOSPITAL

- This packet of information
- A copy of your living will or durable power of attorney for health care (advanced directives) if you have one
- Any toiletry items you would like
- Bring all your current medications. You will not be permitted to take your home medications while in the hospital, but the nurses need the names(s) and dosage(s) of each medication
- Please <u>do not bring valuables</u> to the hospital, such as purse, wallet, jewelry, money, credit cards, etc. Bring only your ID and insurance cards.

LENGTH OF THE EXAM: The test usually takes 45-60 minutes. However, plan to be at the hospital for the <u>full day</u> for the preparation, procedure and recovery from the procedure. If you require an angioplasty in addition to the cardiac catheterization, you will likely be admitted to the hospital for an overnight stay.

AFTER THE EXAM: You may eat and drink after the test.

SCHEDULING AND REGISTRATION: Pre-registration is required for an accurate medical record and proper billing. You may be contacted by a patient access representative if

we need any information. If you have questions or need to reschedule your exam, please call the cardiologist office that scheduled your exam.

HOSPITAL PARKING

Free visitor parking is available in Lot 3 across from the Bedford building; enter from 6th Street. Valet parking is available at the Seventh Street and Bedford building entrances for a fee - or free if you are a handicapped motorist. Deck parking is available on 7th street for a fee, based on your length of stay.

DIRECTIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT

Ambulatory Cardiac Unit is in the Heart and Vascular Center (Lot 3 parking is the closest parking). It is located on the first floor of the Bedford Building. After entering the Bedford lobby, turn to your right and enter the Heart and Vascular Center then proceed to the left through the door into the Ambulatory Care Unit. Please sign in on the kiosk (iPad) at the desk and have a seat on the left side of the waiting room until you are called.
